



TERRACE BAY HIGH SCHOOL GIRLS WIN NORTH SHORE BASKETBALL CHAMPIONSHIP.

Last Saturday at Marathon, in the second Round Robin Tournament of the 1957-58 season, the local team played a two game series with Nip-Rock and Marathon and succeeded in retaining their championship status of the previous year. The girls impressive record of 14 straight wins without a loss was ended by a determined Nip-Rock team in the close scoring tightly fought second game. Although this loss to Nip-Rock was a critical one as it endangered their championship hopes the team had a 34 point advantage over Nip-Rock from their first tournament and this point advantage was sufficient to declare Terrace Bay the winners.

In the first game against a greatly improved Marathon team the girls utilized their bottle-type zone defense and capitalized on some accurate shooting and playmanship on offense to defeat their opponents by a 39 to 29 score. Captain Daisy Lehto with 11 points was high scorer with the remainder of the points being evenly distributed among the first team.

Fownes and McCuaig of Marathon displayed their skill with 12 and 11 points respectively.
