- EGGS FLORENTINE -

1 box frozen chopped spinach,  
cooked and drained.

4 eggs, poached,  
Puffy Cream Sauce,  
 $\frac{1}{4}$  cup grated Parmesan cheese

Put spinach in hot, shallow, broiler-proof baking dish, and make 4 depressions in it. Put 1 egg in each of the depressions. Cover with Sauce, and sprinkle with cheese. Put under broiler a few minutes until delicately browned. Makes 4 servings.

Puffy Cream Sauce

Melt 3 tablespoons butter; blend in 3 tablespoons flour,  $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon salt, and dash cayenne. Gradually add  $1\frac{1}{4}$  cups milk, and cook, stirring until thickened.

Remove from heat, and fold in  $\frac{1}{4}$  cup heavy cream, which has been whipped.
