their efforts towards the elimination of injuries in their plant.

Mill Manager R. G. Shirriff thanked Mr. Steele for the award and replied that every employee had been congratulated for establishing such a good safety record and that Mr. D. C. Porter the first mill manager should receive credit for having taken such an active part in the mill safety program and instilling in each supervisor the importance of good safety policies.

Mr. Shirriff continued by saying that Mr. J. C. Wig, who was mill manager for ten months during 1957 should receive the award at this time and that the efforts put forth to promote safety in the past years would certainly be continued.

During 1957 the Pulp and Paper Industry of Ontario recorded a frequency of 13.8 for the lowest in the history of the industry. This was a 2.3 percentage improvement over the 1956 frequency rate experience.
