a start on this program was made during the year. The usual inoculations against diphtheria, whooping cough, and tetanus as well as vaccination against smallpox were continued throughout the year.

There were only 2 cases of scarlet fever discovered during the year and only one case of whooping cough. There were 13 cases of mumps but only one of simple measles.

All schools were found to be in excellent sanitary condition.

Weekly inspections of the North Camp facilities, including bunkhouses, kitchen, refrigerators, and snack bar were done as in previous years.

All water samples submitted from the town to the Provincial Laboratory have been reported as "A".

Garbage collection and sewage disposal are done in a satisfactory manner.

During 1957, there were 69 births to residents of Terrace Bay in our hospital and a total of 147 births.

There were 2 adult deaths during the year and one stillbirth.

To the Chairman and Members,  
The Board of Health for the Improvement  
District of Terrace Bay,

Gentlemen:

I beg to submit my annual report upon the health and sanitary conditions of our community for the year ending December 31st, 1957.

In general, the community has enjoyed a good year as far as health and sanitary conditions are concerned with comparatively little infectious disease.

As in previous years, examination of new pupils in both grade schools was carried out and frequent visits made to both schools by the school nurse and myself for immunization. Routine examination of various grades for infestation and septic throat and skin conditions was done at intervals.

All children of the town over the age of six months have been or are in the process of being immunized against poliomyelitis. We are now able to obtain sufficient of this vaccine to immunize all adults as well and
