Another Lenten Dish:-

TUNA PIZZA

Heat over to 450 -  
(extremely hot).

1. Mix  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup Evaporated Milk,  
 $\frac{3}{4}$  cup grated Parmesan cheese &  
 $\frac{1}{2}$  teasp. Onion Salt.  
Let stand until thick.
2. Using prepared biscuit mix, or your own, roll out one big thin biscuit 12 in. across. Put in ungreased cooky pan and bake near centre of oven 5 min. Remove from oven and loosen with spatula, but leave on pan.
3. Spread cheese mixture almost to edge of biscuit; cover with  $\frac{1}{2}$  cup Catsup or Chili Sauce, then with a 7 oz. can Tuna, drained and broken into pieces.
4. Return to oven for 7 min. or until crust is golden brown. Serve hot.
