

COFFEE CLOUD SPONGECAKE

l tablespoon instant coffee
l cup boiling water
6 egg whites
½ teaspoon cream of tartar
½ cup fine granulated sugar
6 egg yolks
l½ cups fine granulated sugar
2 cups sifted all purpose flour
3 teaspoons baking powder
½ teaspoon salt
l cup finely chopped pecans.

Dissolve the coffee in the boiling water and cool. Beat egg whites with the cream of tartar until soft peaks form. Add ½ cup sugar gradually and beat until very stiff (do not underbeat). Beat egg yolks well. Add ½ cups sugar gradually and beat until thick and lemon-colored. Sift flour, baking powder and salt together three times. Stir these dry ingredients into the egg-yolk mixture with the pecans. Fold in the egg-white mixture, one quarter at a time. After last addition, fold only until blended. Bake in a 10-inch tube pan at 350 degrees F. for 60 to 70 minutes. Invert and cool at least one hour. Frost with Coffee Icing.
