



PARTY SHRIMP CURRY

- 4 tablespoons butter
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped onion
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup chopped green pepper
- 4 tablespoons flour
- 1 clove garlic, minced
- 1 tablespoon curry powder
- $\frac{1}{4}$ teaspoon dry mustard
- 1 teaspoon salt
- $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups (20-ounce can) canned tomatoes
- 1 apple, peeled and diced
- 1 banana, sliced
- 2 cups cooked deveined shrimp
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup white wine.

Melt butter in a chafing dish. Add onion and green pepper. Saute until tender. Stir in flour, garlic, seasonings and tomatoes. Cook until mixture is smooth and thick. Add apple, banana and shrimp and cook until hot, stirring occasionally. Just before serving, stir in wine, heat for one minute and serve immediately over hot, cooked rice. If the mixture is too thick, dilute slightly with hot water or bouillon. Makes 6 servings.
