KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS

St. Edward's Council of the Knights of Columbus from Schreiber, Terrace Bay and Marathon received the honour of being named Best Council in Ontario at the 55th Annual Ontario State Convention held last weekend in Niagara Falls. This is the third successive year that St. Edward's placed in the top five. There are 93 Councils in Ontario with a total membership of 26,000.

Grand Knight Colin McGrath of Schreiber was official delegate for St. Edward's. District Deputy F. J. Syvitski of Schreiber, was also in attendance.

The four-day convention, held at the Sheraton-Brock Hotel, was highlighted by an address at the state banquet Sunday

evening by the Hon. Paul Martin, Minister of National Health and Welfare in the St. Laurent Government, who in 1956 received the brotherhood award from the Canadian Council of Christians and Jews and the Christian Culture Award of Assumption University, Windsor.

On Sunday, Most Reverend W. J. Smith, Bishop of Pembroke and Ontario State Chaplain, Knights of Columbus, celebrated solemn Mass and delivered the Convention sermon at St. Ann's Church. After Mass the Knights Paraded to the Cenotaph, Oakes Garden Theatre, and laid a wreath.

Mayor Ernest M. Hawkins, of Niagara Falls, extended a civic welcome to the delegates followed by a business session and a tour of the scenic points for the ladies.
