LINDA MACFADYEN AND PAUL HEENAN RECEIVE KIWANIS PROFICIENCY AWARDS

On June 23 and 25 presentations were made at the Public School and the Separate School by Mr. Dave Locking, representing the Kiwanis Club of Terrace Bay, who presented the annual awards to Paul Heenan of the Separate School and to Linda MacFadyen of the Public School.

These awards are in the form of a medallion which the students retain, and then a plaque with their names engraved thereon is retained in each school. In conjunction with these awards F. O. Soughton, proprietor at the Gift Shop, presented each winner with a lovely watch.

This will be the third year the Kiwanis Club have presented these awards in conjunction with the principals of the schools concerned, and the third year the winners have received a watch.

Students in Grades 7 and 8 are eligible for this award, but to be eligible they must have a yearly scholastic average of at least 70%. By a system of balloting by the students of Grades 7 and 8 and the teachers of the school, the winner is selected. In other words the awards are not given on strictly academic standing, and it is intended in this way to encourage all students to be all-around good citizens, able to take their place in the business and community life.

Congratulations are certainly deserved by Linda and Paul.

Paul, incidentally is the first boy to receive this award. The two previous years all girls took the awards. So Paul has shown the way for the boys and it is hoped that the boys will keep in the running in future years.
