BUSH FIRE COMMITTEE - A committee comprised of George Maitland, Stan Hodgkiss and Gordon Kydd, has been functioning for the past two or three weeks, together with the Plant Engineer on analyzing the problems connected with combating a bush fire in the general area of Terrace Bay. The Committee has been poring over maps, establishing water supplies, discussing communications, transportation, etc.

As part of their work, they have recommended that a bulletin board be set up where every person working in the mill can see it, showing what the fire hazard for the particular day or week is. This information will be obtained direct, by phone from Pays Plat to the Services Dept., and published each day for the information of the mill employees and the town in general.

Everybody understands the weather forecast when the weatherman calls for fair and warmer, scattered showers, thunderstorms and so on.

They help plan picnics, outings and especially travel. But do they understand the forest fire danger ratings posted to warn when the burning rate is low, medium, high or extreme? Well, here is what they mean. All call for care with fire in the bush: LOW - Fires will start from an open flame and spread slowly.

MEDIUM - Fires start readily from an open flame, burn briskly and spread rapidly.

HIGH - Fires start rapidly from an open flame, blowing cinders, cigarette butts, etc., and tend to crown in suitable fuels.

EXTREME - Fires start readily from sparks, burn fiercely, crown and spot generally, and are unusually difficult to control during the heat of the day.
