

## MOCK APPLE FILLING

Combine 2 cups water, 1-1/2 cup sugar, 2 teaspoons cream of tarter.

Cook to boiling. Add 30 Ritz Crackers whole. Boil 2 minutes without stirring. Remove from heat. Add I teaspoon grated lemon rind and I tablespoon lemon juice. Again do not stir. Cool. Pour into pastry lined 9" pie pan. Sprinkle with sugar and cinnamon; dot with butter. Cover with pastry and bake in hot oven (400°) for 15 minutes. Reduce heat to 375° and bake 45 minutes more.
