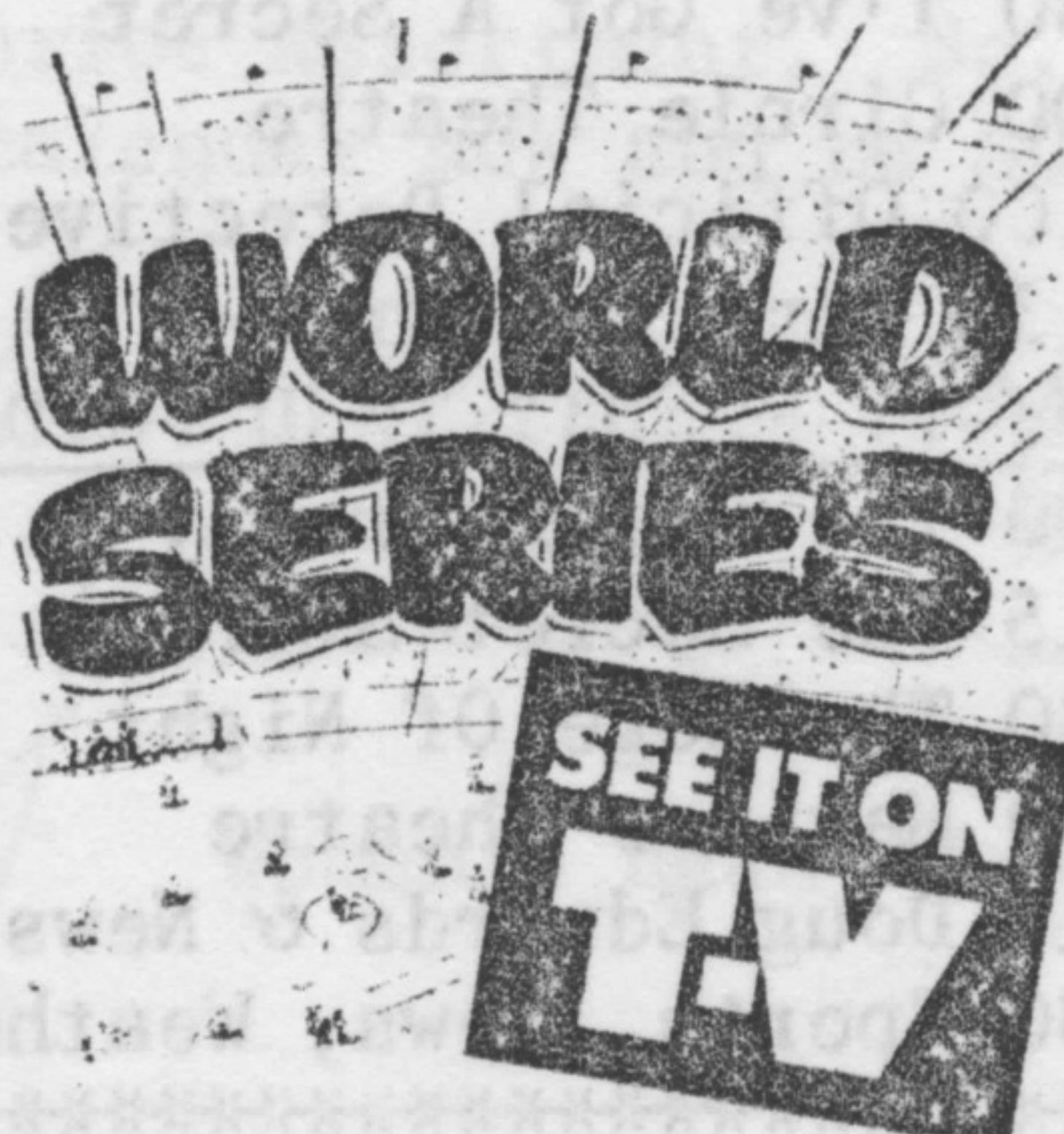
Brian Stewart and Raoul Fournier have just returned from part of their annual vacation with time still left to visit in the immediate district.
