students who indicated they would go beyond 4th form or if they planned to do so it would not be in Terrace Bay. Therefore, the local high school could not plan on having a 5th form this year.

In Schreiber last year there were 8 students in 5th form including at least 2 from Terrace Bay which makes for a very small class. And a class that small presents problems from a teaching and administrative standpoint.

From our point of view it appears that both schools have their problems in conducting a 5th form. We suggest the answer is to have only one 5th form in the district. This would enable school authorities to make plans well in advance and a well planned, well staffed 5th form for the district would surely attract all the potential 5th form students in the district. Why spend rate payer's money attempting to operate two very small 5th form classes when one good sized 5th form would be that much more adequate.

From an educational, economic, and administrative standpoint a district 5th form would be most advantageous. And we believe it would enable district students to plan their education more thoroughly and go on to obtain their 5th form in their own district. How many 4th form students have not gone to 5th form because of the lack of adequate district facilities?

FIRE PREVENTION

Don't get stuck with a worthless "beer can" type of fire extinguisher, warns Fire Chief Maitland. You'll be more than cheated--you'll be putting your family and your home in greater danger by depending on such gadgets.

They come in tin cans, aerosol cans and plastic containers. They may contain a liquid or a powder.

And they're dangerous principally because they just aren't big enough to do the job you need them for -- to put out a fire in its first stages. That means the fire may get out of control, and you could be risking your life.

When you buy a fire extinguisher, look for a UL or FM label on it -- a label which shows it has been thoroughly tested for reliability. You'll be safer if you do.
