HOLIDAY WEEKEND MARRED BY ACCIDENT HERE

An accident occurred at the corner of Highway 17 and Hudson Drive about 8.50 P.M. on Thanksgiving day when Mr. George Lehto, C.P.R. employee, aged 57, was struck by a car driven by Edwin Nicol Terrace Bay. The victim suffered fractures of the right hip and arm, a skull fracture and lacerations of the scalp. He was taken by Terrace Bay Ambulance to Port Arthur Hospital for treatment.

The Ontario Provincial Police are investigating the accident.

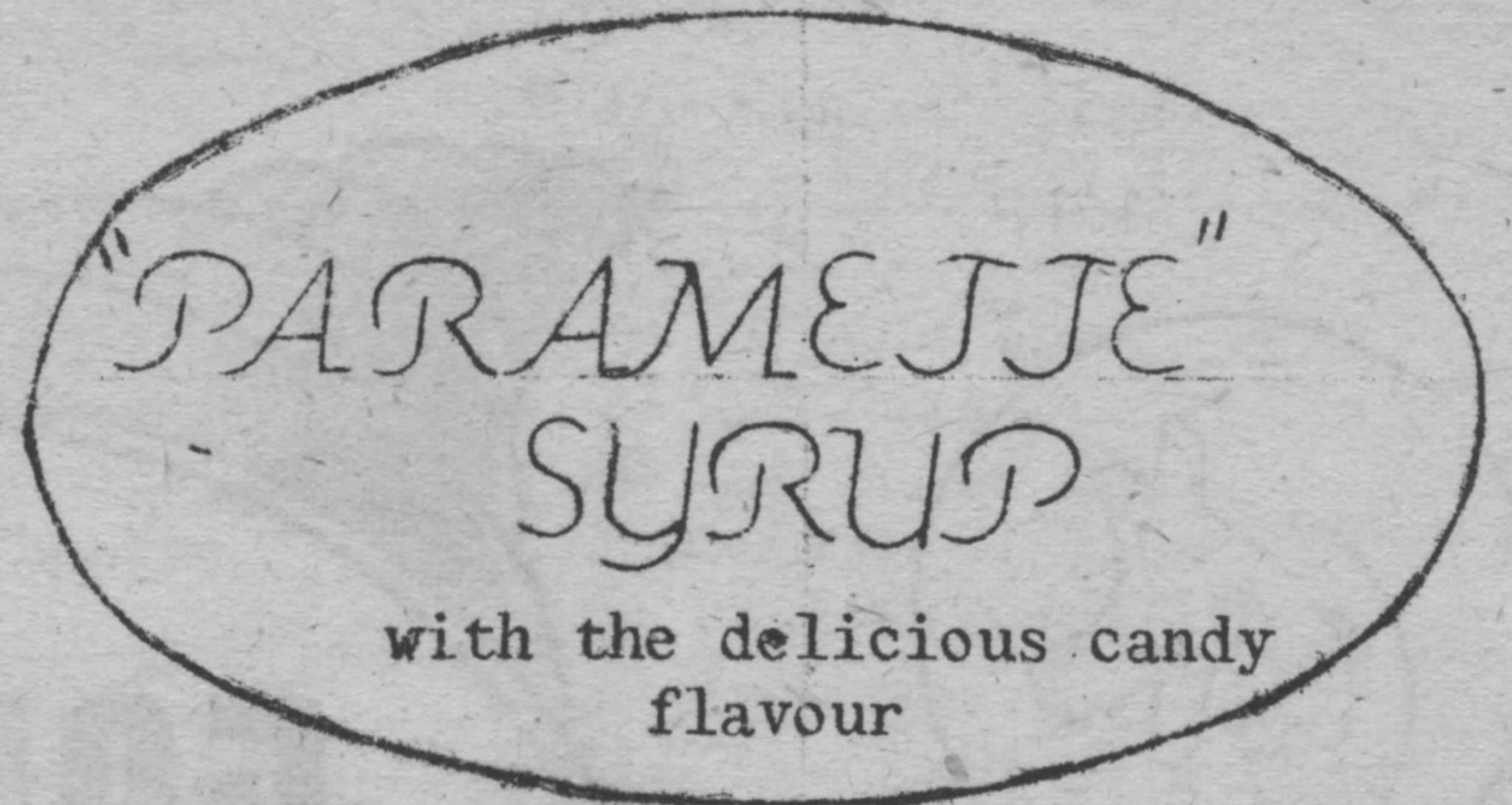

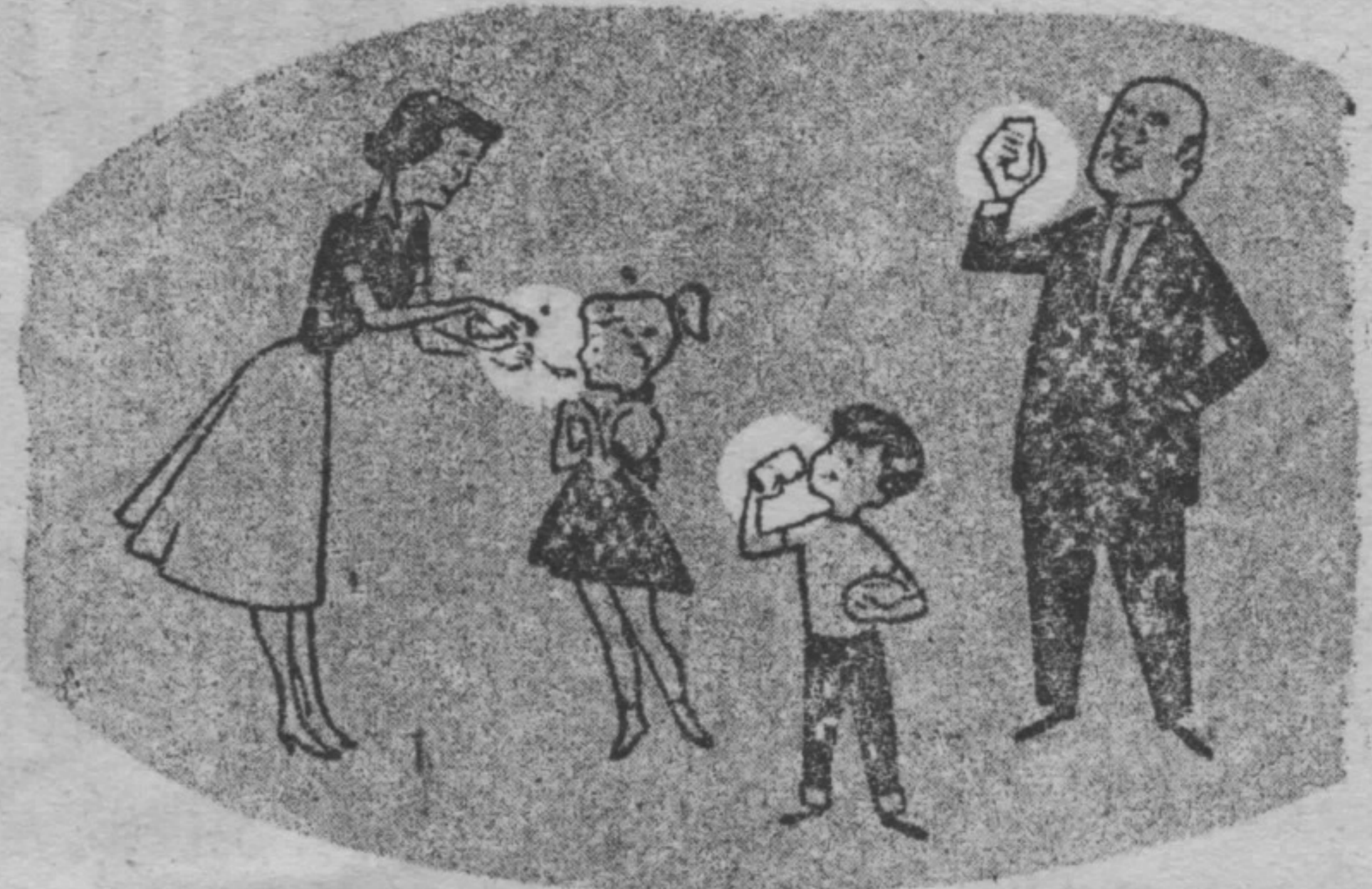
