Reeve W. E. D'Arcy presided for the regular 10th meeting of the Municipal Council with Councillors J. F. Caccamo, F. V. Harness, G. Gordon and clerk-treasurer R. C. Skinner present. Mr. Harness reported that the police work in town was found to be satisfactory. Additional street lights have been placed and strings of coloured lights installed.

A ruling on use of ice by the High School was passed by Council. The High School was also granted free use of the Town Hall for Badminton and a fee set for similar use by the student council.

A wreath was ordered to place on the Cenotaph on Remembrance Day. A letter was received in reference to a hospital bill sent the Council. Waterworks accounts totalling \$1,012.47 and general accounts amounting to \$7,689.18 were ordered paid. Rat poison is being placed on the town garbage dump. All water services not paid up by Oct. 25th will be shut off with a fee of \$3.00 for re-connecting. Court of Revision on assessment appeals will be held on Nov. 4th in the town hall at 7 P.M.
