

LOOKING BACK - Excerpts from the Terrace Bay News

August, 1946 - The railroad spur to the Mill-site is under construction - clearing and burning at the Millsite continues - clearing is nearly completed for the new road out to the Trans-Canada Highway. In the Townsite 13 house foundations are finished - one house has been erected. In the entire project 241 men are employed exclusive of bush clearing crews.

December, 1946 - The ten Terrace Bay families spent Christmas Eve at a party in one of the newly constructed homes.

In '46 housewives purchased all provisions outside of the community for there were no stores in Terrace Bay.

In '46 electricity to cook the Christmas dinner came from diesel generating units.

December 9, 1946 - "Next we visit the McCausland household", there we find a young family working to put their house in ship-shape order. "Ed Brady is now under contract as a baby sitter for Judy and Susie McCausland, five and four years respectively".

March 18, 1947 - Welcome to Terrace Bay. Bill and Mrs. Louk; Dave and Mrs. McDonald.

Bridge party at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Ralph Williams. Present - Mrs. Lemon, Mrs. Butcher, Mrs. Marsh, Mrs. Paget, Mrs. D. MacDonald, Mrs. Soughton, Miss Grace Noer, Mrs. Seed, Mrs. Roberts, Mrs. Christianson, Mrs. McCausland, Mrs. Smith, Mrs. Hodgkiss, Mrs. Isbester, Mrs. Lowe. Guest of honour Mrs. Flatt.

April 22, 1947 - A hearty welcome to Mrs. Joe Heenan, along with youngsters, Paul, age 3 years and Margaret Jane, 3 months.

Welcome to H.C. Laundry, LongLac's Personnel Superintendent, transferred from Toronto Office.

May 20, 1947 - Get those ration books turned in. The W.P.T.B. has requested us to turn in the names of any persons who have not turned in their ration books.

April 1, 1947 - A special church service on Easter Sunday afternoon at 3:30 p.m. Reverend A. F. Lavender of Schreiber will conduct the service.

August 27, 1947 - On September 2nd, 1947 in House #106 a school will open for the first time in Terrace Bay. Principal Clarence Smith. Pupils:

September 10, 1947 - Terrace Bay has been officially designated as St. Martin's Parish. First parish priest appointed is Rev. James Delaney.

November 5, 1947 - November 4th, 1947 Terrace Bay Curling Association officially organized - Chairman: Rune Ostling, Committee members: Jack Wellings, Cliff Knauff, Jim Whyte & Nelson Newton.

December 18, 1947 - In future all orders for coal, coke & wood should be placed with J.P. Heenan at the Admin. Office in the Lower Camp.

House 16 - Christmas party. The engagement of Marg. Kiff to Charlie Simmer was announced on Fri., Dec. 12th. This is really the first romance among LongLac employees at Terrace Bay.

June 24, 1948 - New Bridge over Aguasabon will be open for traffic on June 28th. Continued on Pg.
