## TERRACE BAY-MARATHON HOCKEY GAME

In a wide open, hard hitting game between Terrace Bay Superiors and Marathon Mercuries, Terrace Bay outscored the Mercuries six to 4. Both teams came up with better positional games than those they turned in just one week ago against the Port Arthur Bearcats.

Pollard for Terrace opened the scoring at 9.01 of the first period assisted by Blom, only to have Charyna aided by Cox and Leblanc even the score at 11.52.

Amadeo put Marathon one up at 5.55 of the second when he scored unassisted. At 11.19 Pollard evened the score with his second goal assisted by Blom and Pytyck. Blom combining with Pollard and Lindquist gave Terrace the lead at 14.27 but Cox, from Koslowski came right back at 17.23 to tie the score at three all.

In the third period Terrace came up with two quick goals, Lindquist from Tookenay at 2.46 and Wainikka from Lindquist at 3.41 and Terrace was in front to stay. Cox unassisted narrowed the gap at 10.25, but Marvin Osmar from Desrosiers put the game on ice when he scored for Terrace at 12.03.

This game was the first of a two game total goals series between the two clubs for the Soughton Jewelers Trophy. Second game to be played in Marathon December 11th.
