

STRICT-COURT NEWS

Magistrate's Court was held in Schreiber O.P.P. Court Room at 11.00 A.M. on January 13th, 1959 with Magistrate T.A. Connor presiding. Crown Attorney P.V. Ibbetson, Q.C. acted for the Crown.

Jerry Flook of Port Arthur, convicted of operating an automobile without a driver's license was fined \$22.00 and W.N. McKenzie of Marathon, convicted of driving a car without three lights was fined \$12.00.

Five Schreiber, Terrace Bay and Kossport juveniles charged under the Liquor Control Act with consuming liquor while a minor were fined \$22.50 each.

Frank Arthurs of Manitowadge and Alphonse Riasson of Marathon forfeited bail of \$17.50 on charges of having liquor in a place other than his residence

Dante Sdraulig of Manitowadge was convicted of driving a motor vehicle while his license was under suspension and paid a fine of \$75.00 and costs. Investigating Officer on all the above cases was Prov. Constable W.J. Cringle.
