DON'T OVER FUSE

When your teeth are troubling you there is little doubt that you will see a dentist--if you are sick you will see a doctor. When a fuse burns out it is a sure sign that the electrical system is sick and you will need the professional service of an electrician, who, like the doctor or dentist, will explain what the source of the trouble is and will recommend the cure.

Electric fuses in your fuse box act as safety valves so be sure that you are using the right fuse for your system. No engineer would operate a boiler or run an engine unless the safety valve was functioning properly and you too should not operate an electric system without the proper fuse. If fuses burn out regularly do check to see that your circuits are not overloaded, never replace them with heavier fuses without professional help. A blown fuse is a warning--put a heavier one in and you will have a fire sure. When this happens, play safe, call your doctor (electrician) & he will suggest the cure.
