FISH & GAME ASSOCIATION HOLD ANNUAL MEETING

A recent meeting of the club was held to receive the annual reports from various committees and to elect officers for 1959.

Vice-Pres. Elmer Persson as chairman, presented a report reviewing the club's activities during the year, mentioning in particular, that the Nature Trail opened last year had been well received by local people and visitors and that such a response justified further effort to extend the trail and its facilities.

He also noted that four resolutions had been originated by the club relative to matters of fish and game management and that these had been processed by the parent Federation of Ontario Anglers & Hunters and presented to the Provincial Government.

Treasurer F. Sechesky presented his financial statement showing a favourable balance.

The Hunter Safety Training Program was

reported on by Stan Hodgkiss for Chairman N. Coan. It was pointed out that 13 children and two adults had been qualified on this course. Every effort will be made to hold additional courses in the near future for local children.

From the election held, the following officers were chosen: President, E.A. Persson; Vice-Pres., V. Hopper; Treasurer, F. Sechesky and Secretary, S. Hodgkiss.

Committee Chairmen were appointed as follows; Jr. Program & Hunter Safety, G. Kydd, Membership, A. Delaronde; Ways & Means, J.B. Garvin; Fish restocking, G. Black.

One of the main items of business discussed was in connection with the Northwestern Ontario Conservation Federations spring convention which will be held in Terrace Bay in late April with the local club acting as host.
