KIMBERLY-CLARK - SAFEST MILL IN ONTARIO IN 1958



The above photo shows Mill Manager R.G. Shirriff with the Ontario Pulp & Paper Association Shield awarded to the safest Mill in Ontario. Since the start-up of the Kimberly-Clark Pulp & Paper Company Limited Mill at Terrace Bay in 1948 many awards have been received in recognition of their outstanding safety records.

During 1958 Mill employees worked for 1,307,807 man hours with only two disabling injuries for an accident frequency rate of 1.53 and a time loss of twelve days. This low accident frequency rate has won for Kimberly-Clark the Ontario Pulp & Paper Makers Safety Association award as the "Safest Mill in Ontario" for class 'A' Mills, (mills which work more than 50,000 hours per month) for the third consecutive year.

Accident prevention has always been important in the Kimberly-Clark Mill. During the last ten years of operation employees worked over 13 Million man hours for an accident frequency rate of 4.15. Three times employees have completed over a million man hours without a disabling injury.

The theme "Safety is Everybody's Business" certainly holds true at the Terrace Bay mill. Unions and employees all take an active part in serving on various mill safety committees to assist management in

its accident prevention program.

Quality Production with Safety has been the keynote of operation. Management has a moral responsibility for the safety of its employees, a responsibility they intend to carry out. Like quality and production the safety program must produce results.
