SPORTSMAN'S SHOW TO FEATURE POSTER CONTEST

A feature of the 1959 Northwestern Ontario Sportsman's Show will be the students' poster conservation contest. Entries are invited from Northwestern Ontario students in grades four to eight.

Show chairman J.D. Evans estimates that more than 1,000 posters will be entered from nearly every community in this region. Purpose of the contest is to stimulate interest, in children and adults, in the conservation of our natural resources. Any subject dealing with preservation of our forests and streams, wildlife, etc., is acceptable.

Posters will be judged for originality, theme and artistic ability. They may be done at home or in school, but their originality must be certified by either the student's parent or teacher.

A panel of three qualified judges will select the top three posters in each of the five grades, as well as the best overall entry received, regardless of grade.

Winners in each of the five grades will receive flash camera outfits, with second and third winners receiving an art supply kit and a pair of nature books.

A portable transistor radio will be awarded to the grand prize winner. Judging will take place after March 31st, closing date for entries.

"Importance of conservation to Northwestern Ontario is one of the primary objectives of the Sportsman's Show!" says Evans, "and the students' poster contest helps to accomplish this in several ways".

The discussions on conservation, begun in the classroom, are frequently carried over into the home, as young students' imaginations begin to grasp the significance of this subject and think out ways of depicting it on a poster.

As in previous years, the top fifty posters - 10 from each grade, will be prominently displayed during the four-day Sportsman's Show, April 22-25, in the Fort William Gardens and Curling Club.

The poster contest is a project of the vocational Guidance Committee, under the chairmanship of Terry Batters, of the Kiwanis Club of West Fort William, sponsors of the Sportsman's Show.
