HOLY THURSDAY, March 26th

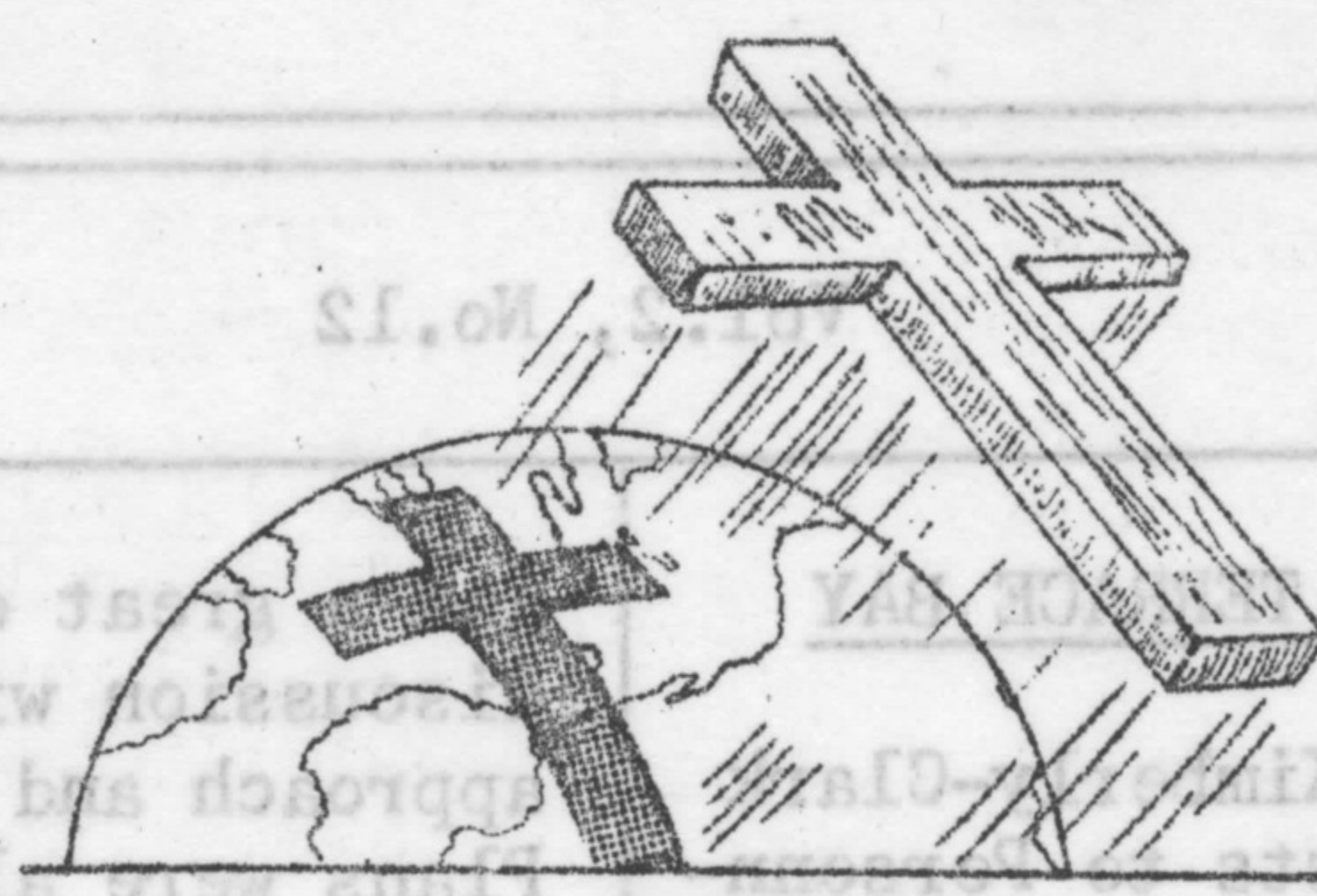

GOOD FRIDAY, March 27th

No morning service. Veneration of the Cross reading of the Sacred Passion and the Solemn Communion Service at 3:00 P.M. Holy Communion may be received provided that the fast from solid foods is observed from 12:30 Noon Friday. Other conditions as noted for Thursday. At 7.30 P.M. Stations of the Cross followed by Confessions.

HOLY SATURDAY, March 28th

No morning service. Confessions from 10.00 to 12.00 Noon; from 3.00 to 6.00 P.M. and from 7.30 to 9.00 P.M. At 11.00 P.M. the Easter Vigil Service, Blessing of the New Fire, Paschel Candle, Holy Water etc., followed by High Mass. To receive Communion at this time it is necessary to fast from solid foods from 9.00 P.M., from liquids from 11.00 P.M. LENT ENDS ONLY AT MIDNIGHT SATURDAY. Attendance at midnight Mass fulfills the Easter Sunday obligation. The masses on Easter Sunday will be at 8:15 A.M. and 5:45 P.M.
