used so widely by swimmers, boaters and fishermen, it is gratifying to see the work being done by municipal recreation committees and other agencies to reduce water accidents. The response to the water safety instructor courses being held this spring is far beyond what we had expected" Mr. Mungham said. Already the course being held in April at Ft. William H.M.C.A. is oversubscribed by 23 persons and it looks like the proposed June course will be filled, too."
