

SWIMMING INSTRUCTION NEWS:

For several years now, it has been very difficult to get children out regularly to swimming classes during the symmer. Although many have registered, attendance at classes drops off gradually after the first few weeks.

In this area where we are surrounded by water and where a great deal of our leisure time is spent on or near the water, it is essential that our children receive instruction and learn to swim well. Because of this each year, the Recreation Association provides swimming classes during the summer months. Unfortunately, attendance has been very irregular, making it almost impossible for the instructor to keep his programme operating.

This year, instruction will again be provided under the direction of Mr. Ralph Warren, Red Cross Instructor from Hamilton. However, to assure regular attendance at classes, a \$1.00 refundable fee will be charged to those registering. If the swimmer attends 75% of t the lessons (approximately 15 out of 20) the fee will be returned. Otherwise, it will be forfeited. This is being done so that parents will take a greater interest in seeing that their children attend classes. It is very important that they learn water safety, but we must have regular turnouts so that the job can be done well.

REM-MB-R...we are not charging for swimming instruction. If the child and parent accept their responsibility, the fee will be returned. In many centres this service costs a great deal of money. All we're asking for is regular attendance. Registration forms will be circulated through the schools shortly
