

**ED CAVANAUGH'S 7-POINT ELECTION PROGRAM**

I hereby submit for your approval, my friends, the most pressing problems of our first election in relation to their importance, as I see them.

**FIRST & FOREMOST:**

The precedent we set in this election, I believe, will have a distinct bearing on many future elections.

I have the utmost respect and admiration for the ability of my opponent, John Ferrier, but feel duty bound to acquaint you with the following possibilities.

In this change-over the Municipal Board of Ontario is saying in effect to us, "Terrace Bay is now your Corporation to be administered by you through your elected representatives in Council". Are we prepared to accept that responsibility?

Your Council will be composed mostly of Mill Workers and I ask you how effectively such a body could function sitting under their daily supervisor and by the same token with what degree of freedom an official of any company in a one-industry town would be at liberty to express his own decisions on important legislation.

**SECONDLY**

If elected I will do all in my power to retain and extend the existing excellent working relations between the Company and the Municipality and consult with the Company on any major Policy changes without in any way jeopardizing the autonomy of Council.

**THIRDLY**

Situated as we are about half way in this vast area between the Lakehead and White River I believe we should exert every effort to interest the Ontario Government in establishing here headquarters for Departments of Lands & Forests, Game & Fish, Mines and Hydro.

**FOURTH**

I will suggest the setting up of a Planning Board to determine our needs for at least five years in Zoning, Roads, Buildings, Schools, Parks and Recreation.

**FIFTH**

I will recommend that the Local Unions be requested to submit candidates for representation on appointed boards.

**SIXTH**

We have come to a point where we will have to take a careful look at our spending dollar and to that end we should set up a capable Finance Committee.

**SEVENTH**

I believe it is time we compiled a list of potential home owners and give them leadership in receiving help through the Central Mortgage and Housing Authority or interested private Builders.

We have other minor problems which my long service on the Improvement District Board and many local organizations has given me the background to foresee and deal with.

I must point out that during my time on the Board I have served under three different chairmen, all indirectly appointed by the Company and have represented these busy men at dozens of local functions. I am stationary here and have the time and desire to serve, if you want Government of the People by the People for all the People. All the time, I ask you to give me a sufficient mandate on June 24th to do so effectively. In any case please VOTE. For sitters or transportation call 3612 or 3220.

**ELECTION DAY, June 24**

Free:- The right to vote for the candidates of your choice. As a candidate for councillor, I urge you to exercise this right. YOUR vote is important.

In Terrace Bay we have much to learn about managing our town. If elected, I have the interest, the desire, and the time available to devote to the work of Council and the task of learning. I request your vote in my favour.
