SWIMMING POOL CANVASS BEING CONDUCTED HERE

The Terrace Bay Swimming Pool Committee have distributed a letter to all residents here outlining prepared plans for a swimming pool and the total cost of same.

A volunteer canvasser will contact every wage-earner in Town to see if they are willing to make a financial contribution toward the cost of the pool. In addition to a contribution of approximately \$100.00 over a two year period for the capital cost, it will be necessary to increase the Recreation Fee by fifty cents per month to help defray the operating costs. The Terrace Bay Swimming Pool Committee has spent considerable time investigating the pros and cons of various types of pools. Their letter of June 15th explains all the details. The decision to have a swimming pool, or not have one, now rests with all of us living in Terrace Bay. Most people would agree that a swimming pool would be a terrific advantage in many ways.
