HIGHWAY SAFETY

Although the accident rate in Terrace Bay is low, patrolling Police officers have noted that there are some infractions of the Highway Traffic Act taking place, such as failing to come to a dead stop at stop signs; improper turns at intersections; faulty lights and equipment etc., that could result in death, injury and/or property damage to innocent persons, as well as the person or persons responsible.

Listed below are the regulations which came into force on May 25th this year.

- 1. Section 28 of the REGULATIONS.

 You must lower your headlights.
 - (1) When within 500 feet of an approaching motor vehicle and.
 - (2) When following another motor vehicle within 200 feet.
- 2. Section 16(a) Highway Traffic Act.

 It is an offence to place signs on the window and to hang objects in the motor vehicle which obstructs the driver's view.
 - (a) This section does not prevent the use of signs or markers required under this act or any regulations made under this Act.
- 3. It is an offence to load a truck or trailer in such a way that any part of the load falls on the highway during transit and the penalty for such offence has been increased up to a maximum fine of \$200.00 and in addition the licence or permit may be suspended.
- 4. Passing on the right is now permitted in cities, towns and villages BUT ONLY
 - (1) When overtaking a motor vehicle making a left hand turn -
 - (2) On streets having two or more lanes in each direction, and
 - (3) On one-way streets.

FOURTH ANNUAL TEEN AGE AND COUNSELLOR TRAIN-ING COURSE SLATED

The Fourth Annual Teen Age and Counsellor Training Course is to be held at the Quetico Conference and Training Centre, Kawene, Ont. from Friday, August 28 to Friday, Sept. 4, 1959.

The course is sponsored by the Society of Dorectors of Municipal Recreation, Northwestern Ontario Zone, in co-operation with the Community Programmes Branch of the Ontario Department of Education, and the Quetico Conference and Training Centre.

Adult counsellors and teen club executive members in the ratio of one counsellor to two teen agers will attend from about 12-15 communities in the area. Registrations are expected from such communities as Terrace Bay.
