When the five-day week became part of the Canadian way of life the city family quickly found that Friday night to Sunday night permitted ample time for a camping trip to parks well within its reach. Not every family could afford a cottage or a week-end stay at an established tourist camp but almost everyone could afford the charge of 75 cents a day or \$4 a week charged for camp or trailer sites provided now in provincial parks.

NO SPEAR FISHING IN ONTARIO

Skin divers cannot use spears in Ontario waters. This was emphasized when conservation officers of the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests arrested a Toronto resident just as he emerged from Lake Simcoe wearing a snorkel tube and face mask and carrying an underwater spear. It is illegal to have possession of a spear within fifty feet of the water.

SLOW DRIVING

As a means of encouraging all drivers to drive within reasonable ranges of speed, the law provides a penalty for the operation of a motor vehicle at such a slow rate of speed as to block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic on the highway.

PROVINCIAL PARKS ATTENDANCE RECORDS BROKEN

All attendance records for Ontario's new system of provincial parks are expected to be broken this year, according to the Ontario Department of Lands and Forests, responsible for the operation and maintenance of about 100 parks and their many improvements and added public services. Most of the parks have been established within the past two or three years in an expansion programme unprecedented in the province's history.

Up until 1954, the Provincial Government maintained only six parks -- Algonquin, Quetico, Rondeau, Superior, Sibley and Ipperwash. Then a new government policy came into being calling for the establishment of many more parks to cope with the fast-growing requirements of Ontario residents and (Cont'd next column)
