MICHIGAN RAINBOW TROUT CAUGHT BY JOE DEJONGHE

The Michigan Dept. of Conservation recently advised Joe Dejonghe that the tagged 2 lb. 12 oz. rainbow he caught at the mouth of the Steele on June 5, 1959, was released about fifty miles from Marquette at Two Hearted River. It weighed 6 oz. when released on

May 21, 1958 and caught at a distance of 160 miles from point of release. This was one of 141,000 tagged rainbow trout released.

The local Fish & Game Club contacted the Michigan Department at Ann Arbor who appreciated the information and are anxious to receive as many reports as possible.
