N.S.H.L. SEMI-ANNUAL MEETING HELD OCT. 18TH

On Sunday, October 18th the semi-annual meeting of the N.S.H.L. was held in Terrace Bay.

Bob Abbott of Red Rock was elected President, filling the vacancy created by the resignation of Ted Broughton of Nipigon.

All teams in the League were represented as well as Arena Management from each town concerned. President Fred Page and Gordon Houston attended as representatives of the Thunder Bay Amateur Hockey Association and the local contingent were Governors W. Louk, Jack Thomas and Joe Adamo; Hockey Association President Ken Hutchinson and Arena representative Ken Ward.

The teams will play a twenty-four game schedule this year--12 away and 12 at home.

It was decided that, for Play-offs, the team placing 4th in the League must be within eight points of the 3rd place team or forfeit 5% of their play-off pool.

The 1959-60 Schedule will begin on December 5th and the All Star game between Marathon and the All Stars will be played in Marathon on November 29th.

The Vice-President of the N.S.H.L., Mr. S. Harrison, was appointed referee-in-chief.

The Superior's first league home game will take place on Sunday, December 6th.

Applications for referees for the N.S.H.L. will be accepted up to November 15th by Bill Louk or Jack Thomas.

On October 17th the Engineering Institute of Canada (Lakehead Branch) held their monthly meeting at a luncheon in the Hotel Terrace. There were approximately twenty-three professional engineers present from the Lakehead and District. John A. Ferrier of Terrace Bay was the host member for the meeting.

COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve J.A. Ferrier and councillors Evans-Smith, Heenan, Duncan and Bouchard, together with Clerk-Treasurer Strutt and Assistant Hanley met in Council Chambers on Wednesday, October 14th.

Communications from Highways Department, R.G. Shirriff and the C.P.R., regarding catch-basins, street extension and footpath were discussed. Signs are to be erected at the East end of the overhead.

The Dept. of Highways advised that the legal speed limit on Highway 17 through town is now set at 40 M.P.H. A further reduction may be instituted at a later date.

The Library Report and Grant were discussed and also the O.P.P. report. Three building permits were approved and a new member added to the existing Court of Revision. Mr. Strutt was instructed to comply with the request to provide a list of parties available for Jury duty.

Sound trucks, road signs and centre lines were also discussed and a query elicited the information that townsite street lights are maintained as follows:-- extinguished bulbs are replaced one day a week (Friday) with strings of lights (relays) being replaced as quickly as possible.

Council declared that any new enterprise may open for business in Terrace Bay providing said enterprise complies with the building code, have the property on which to build and pays the required business tax.

Fire Chief George Maitland was highly commended for the fine job done on Fire Prevention.

Police were instructed to keep a sharp lookout for bears in the vicinity of the Town.

The report from the M.O.H. was noted and a request to erect a sign rejected.
