

HORTICULTURAL SOCIETY HOLD ANNUAL MEETING

TERRACE BAY AND MARATHON PLAY TIE GAME

Terrace Bay and Marathon played to a four-all tie in the first exhibition game of the season on Thursday, November 26th. It was a poor showing with rough and "dirty" play dominating the game.

The scoring started with Romano from Ferguson and Brady at 14:45 of the first period and stayed that way until the second period.

Maurice Osmar from Hansen at 0:50 and Maurice Osmar from DesRosiers at 15:59 of the second period put Terrace Bay one goal up. This period was highlighted by Osmar's two goals, and "low-lighted" by Henderson of Marathon receiving a misconduct and a game misconduct penalties.

A goal by Blom from Hansen and Lindquist put Terrace three up early in the third period but a sustained drive by Marathon aided by Terrace Bay's inability to clear the puck from their end resulted in Moon scoring at 10:43 from Romano and Bolan, and Amadeo from Lanteigne at 13:19 of the third.

A penalty to Desrosiers for slashing left Terrace one man short at 14:42 and Kapitán intercepted a pass deep in Terrace Bay Territory and scored unassisted at 15:35 to put Marathon one goal ahead. Stachiw, assisted by Brassard and Hansen tied the score at 18:19 and that ended the scoring.

Leaders for Terrace were Maurice Osmar with two goals and Ray Hansen with three assists. Romano had two goals and an assist for Marathon.

On Sunday the All-Star game was played at Marathon and it was a continuation of the same poor style of hockey. This game was won by Marathon 4 - 3.

Members of the North Shore Hockey League executives and governors are meeting this Saturday to discuss the type of hockey being played this year and it is hoped that they find a solution to the problem in a hurry.
