On November 25th, Reeve J.A. Ferrier, all Councillors, the secretary-clerk and his assistant met in the Municipal Office.

Correspondence was read and dealt with. A letter from the Hospital Matron requesting permission to have a non-profit Tuck Shop for the convenience of hospital patients met with the approval of Council.

The Ontario Hospital Commission and Terrace Bay Private Hospital may enter into an agreement regarding treatment of indigent cases.

Mr. Evans-Smith contacted the Department of Lands and Forests for information and advice on establishment of a site for tourist accommodation in the vicinity of Terrace Bay. In reply to Mrs. Bouchard's communication a letter from the Department of Highways outlined information of town signs, traffic and safety signs, and considerable discussion ensued on the establishment of school patrols.

A request to establish a Landing Field here was rejected by Council for the present.

Public Library accounts were read and approved - Hydro Accounts were read and approved and Township accounts for October were read and approved. The Police Magistrate's report was perused and Building permits for October totalled \$525.00.
