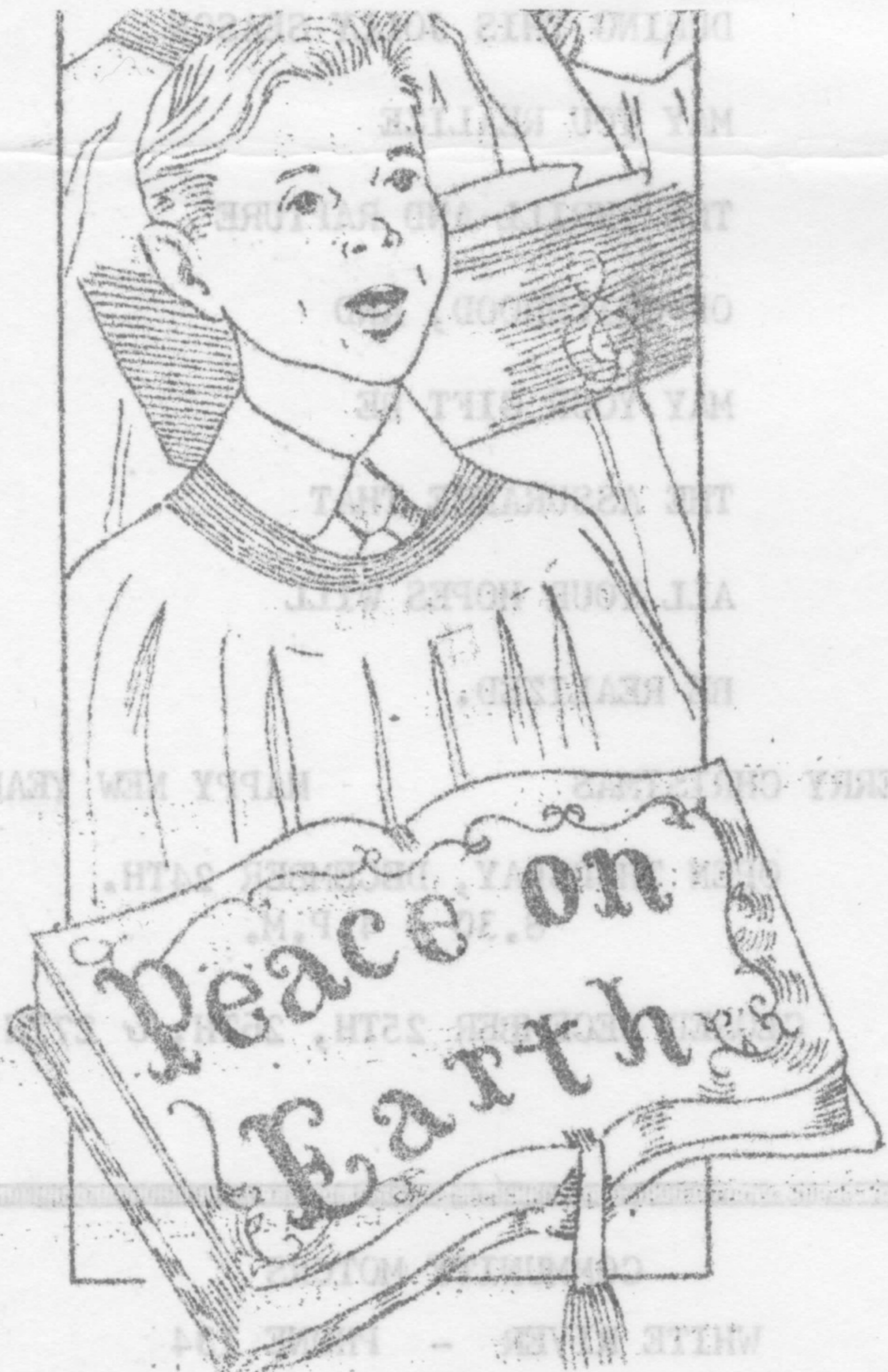
ST. ANDREW'S C.G.I.T. CANDLE LIGHTING SERVICE
