ART AND CREATIVE CRAFT COURSES AT QUETICO

Artists from Northwestern Ontario communities will participate in one of two winter art courses scheduled for February according to Mr. J.B. Fraser, President of the Northwestern Ontario Art Association.

The first course will be a live-in course at the Quetico Conference and Training Centre February 19-22 inclusive and the second will be held at the Lakehead February 24-28 inclusive, centered at the Fort William Public Library.

Instructor for both courses will be Mr. John Bechtel of Kitchener.

Anyone wishing to attend may obtain information and forms from Mrs. Glenna MacDonald, Box 596, Terrace Bay or the Recreation office.

"Learning weaving, rugmaking, drawing, designing and leadership skills and their application in the home and community will be available to craft leaders and persons interested in crafts," said H.E. Thomas, representative of the Community Programmes Branch, in announcing the Creative Community Crafts Course Feb. 29-Mar. 6 at the Quetico Conference and Training Centre.

The five-day, live-in course will be divided into six sections. The training is offered so that Northwestern Ontario communities will have skilled people available to lead craft groups.

The course is open to anyone interested in crafts. Information and application forms can be obtained from the Recreation Office.

The courses are sponsored by the Community Programmes Branch in co-operation with the Quetico Conference and Training Centre.
