## LIBRARY TRUSTEE CONFERENCE IN MARCH

A conference for Library Trustees has been arranged in Fort William for the 18th, 19th and 20th of March.

Library Trustees from some twenty Libraries in Northwestern Ontario have shown interest in this conference. It will be sponsored by the Library Board of the Fort William Public Library and by the Public Library Service Branch of the Department of Education. Members of the Department plan to attend the conference.

Dr. G.K. McKeown, Conference Chairman said recently that "It is our earnest desire to create a situation which will permit representatives of all the Libraries in this area to get together to compare notes, share problems and appreciate our roles and responsibilities better. We hope that this conference will help to compensate for the failure of many library Trustees to attend the Provincial and National conventions. It is long since time that we got together to examine the position and future of Library service in this part of Ontario.

Pre-conference questionnaires indicate a strong interest among Library Trustees in problems of planning, building, staff, adult education and the role of the trustee in the library. Preliminary programme layout includes all these topics.

Resource personnel will be drawn from experienced library trustees in the area, from the Department of Education and other Departments, Librarians and, if possible, from representatives of the Provincial and National Trustees' organizations.
