TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS UP

Despite the demerit system, heightened police enforcement, cross-walks and safety programmes, Ontario's traffic accidents increased in the first eleven months of 1959, reports the Department of Transport.

Two main factors explain the increase; a new accident statistics branch is recording hitherto unreported cases and during 1959 Ontario Drivers drove a billion miles more in addition to 110,256 vehicles being added to the province's roads and 93,150 new drivers.
