## COUNCIL QUOTES

Reeve Ferrier presided last Wednesday afternoon over the regular meeting of Council in the Torrace Bay Municipal Offices. Attending were Councillors Bouchard, Evans-Smith and Duncan, secretary Strutt and assistand Hanley.

Minutes of the past meeting were accepted as read. Reeve Ferrier remarked on the fine job done on clearing the Lakeview extension.

Tenders for the painting of the Ontario Provincial Police Office were opened and Council accepted the bid submitted by Mr. D.Laporte. Inno nov viinutioggo na e il

Various correspondence was received from the Department of Highways concerning the additional strip purchased along the Highway; the installation of concrete sidewalk between Recreation Centre and Hotel; the acceptance of the Department of road maintenance to street approaches at Highway intersection.

Council was notified that Costa's Groceteria have acquired a valuable piece of property in the Town and are moving along with plans for the erection of a modern food market here.

A request for plan for a Mobile Home Park has been sent out and a letter received

from the District Forest Ranger in Geraldton in connection with establishing a tourist area near the Aguasabon Falls, and any possible assistance the Town might expect from the Government, following the completion of expected Legislation on the subject.

School Patrols have been further investigated and a letter received offering assistance in training. Reeve Ferrier felt their offer of an officer to come to Terrace Bay would be of considerable assistance in the establishing of patrols. Mr .Evans-Smith told Council that he, together with Mr. Sam Boyd, had been working on developing Patrols and expected to start on it this year.

Fire report for F ebruary from Mr. Geo. Maitland, Fire Chief of Terrace Bay, was itemized. Reeve Ferrier would check on Constable Hayes receiving an immediate call on any bush fires. Holiday replacements for local O.P.P. have been requested.

The Annual adjustment for use of power was received by Council. Library, Hydro and Township Accounts were itemized and accepted. By-Law for the annual road allowance in Terrace Bay was read and passed. Building Permits for February totalled \$6,150.

Mr. Ferrier praised co-workers of the late Bill Smith who had helped renovate the Smith home. He also inquired into the progress being made on the proposed Industrial area and requested a report be prepared to send to Toronto. Further precautions in regard to No Smoking in the Arena will be instigated by the Recreation Association. A request for clearing of land behind a lot was referred to Mr. J. Wellings.

It was suggested the Cemetary Board be discontinued and that Mr. Evans-Smith, as Development Chairman, head a committee of a few interested parties to handle affairs of the Board.

Council agreed to request a twenty-mile per hour limit on Selkirk as a through street. This request will be forwarded to the Department of Highways before going to Department of Municipal iffairs.

A meeting of the Board of Health preceded Council, with Dr. D.J.M.McCausland submitting his annual report.
