Taxi Proprietor, Mr. A. LeBlanc, was given a hearing Wednesday afternoon by Reeve Ferrier, Councillors Heenan and Bouchard, Secretary-Treasurer Strutt and Assistant Hanly at the regular meeting of Council in the Town Office. The taxi situation in Terrace Bay was reviewed with a partial solution on a home office arrived at for the summer months. Another review will follow up the situation before Winter.

Building permits for the past month totalled \$26,350. A letter from Canadian Geographical advised on names for newly created streets and an application for summer work on town work was received.

Progress on budget work was reported on by Mr. Ferrier. Inquiry by Mrs. Bouchard into replacement of street lights elicited the reply that these are being installed at the rate of three or four a year. A further query by Mrs. Bouchard on the arrival of the sweeper attachment brought Mr. Ferrier's reply that it was expected very soon and that the present manual sweeping was being done to prevent catch basins from plugging.

Fire Chief Maitland's model of a training tower was presented to Council with explanations on erection and cost. Permission was granted to proceed with the building. Approval for one regular and one volunteer fireman to attend the training course in Gravenhurst this summer was given.
