

**MINOR BASEBALL COACHES STILL NEEDED**

Below is a lineup of what coaches we have and what we still require:

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE (6 & 7 years)**

Require 2 coaches to teach basic skills. Times: Tuesday and Thursdays, 4:30 - 5:45 at Separate School Diamond.

**AMERICAN LEAGUE (8 & 9 years)**

Require 3 coaches and umpires for this 3-team league. Maximum of twice weekly from 4:30 to 6:00 at Separate School. (Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays).

**NATIONAL LEAGUE (10, 11 & 12 years)**

We have 3 coaches (L. Swirhun - DODGERS, C. Simmer - BRAVES, D. Blom - GIANTS). Require a coach for the PIRATES in this 4-team league, plus umpires. Maximum of twice weekly from 4:30 - 6:00 at Public School Diamond. (Mondays, Wednesdays or Fridays).

**BANTAM LEAGUE (13, 14 & 15 years)**

Require 3 coaches and umpires for this 3-team league. Maximum of twice weekly at Public School Diamond (Tuesday and Thursday, 4:30 - 6:00 and Saturday at 9 A.M.)

**JUVENILES (16, 17 & 18 years)**

Coach - Rex Taylor. We require an assistant for this team, which practises Tuesdays at 6:00 and Saturdays at 10 A.M.

There are over 200 boys involved and they need YOUR HELP.

**TENNIS PLAYERS**

2. Loosen nets after play! If you leave them tight they stretch and begin to sag.
3. Drag the courts when finished! A canvas drag will be hung near the entrance. Use it frequently and help keep the courts flat and free from holes.
4. Caution others! If you see someone misusing the facilities, make it your responsibility to stop them.
5. Share the courts! Give everyone a chance to play.
