TOWN MILL RATE SET FOR 1960

At a special meeting of Town Council on June 1st, a by-law was passed to set the tax rates for the year 1960.

The General Tax Rate (roads, police, fire, etc.); residential and commercial rates are down slightly from 1959.

Area rates (water, sewer, lights) together with the Public and High School are up slightly, The increase being due to maintenance that is absolutely essential on a septic tank and tile field at the west sewage disposal area. Increase in Public School rate is due to the new house for a teacher residence. The High School will have an additional teacher for 1960. The tax mill rate for Terrace Bay for the year 1960 as it will apply to the average householder in comparison to 1959 is as follows:-

COMETS AGAIN SPLIT DOUBLE HEADER

Nine hits on Kolody and 7 hits on McLay gave the Comets a 4-3 win in the first game of the double header against the Albions Sunday afternoon. The Westfort Albions came back in the second game to whip the Comets 5-1 giving R. Okada a three hit game against Wilkinson's seven hit game.

Polehill up for the first time in the first game batted home T. Costa for the tie breaking run at the end of the 9th inning, both teams were tied three all at the 4th inning. Hitters for the Comets were A. Costa, Taylor, Hansen, Kolody (2), T. Costa and Pytyck.

Kolody had good support from the field throughout the game with only two errors by Hansen and Costa.
