HONOUR DR. LAVENDER (Cont'd from Page 1)

In 1911 he came to Canada and went into missionary work under the Methodist Church in Southern Saskatchewan. After two years in the mission field he entered Theological College in Winnipeg and on graduating was ordained in the Metropolitan Church in Regina.

In 1916 Dr. Lavender married Irma Maloon in Regina, Saskatchewan. His first appointment was at Kelwood, Manitoba where two sons were

born. After spending eighteen years in Manitoba the family moved to Ontario and, for the past twenty-one years have lived in the Thunder Bay District, the last eleven of them in Terrace Bay.

Although ordained in the Methodist Church Dr. Lavender only served in a strictly denominational capacity for one year, the others all being pastoral charges in which one, two or more denominations had affiliated.

During his ministry in Schreiber work began on the Terrace Bay project and the Rev. Owen Barrow and Mr. Lavender were contacted by representatives of the Kimberly-Clark Co., with a view to conducting Protestant services there. These two ministers were also serving Schreiber and Marathon at the same time and, after consultations with each other and with the Bishop of the Diocese of Algoma and the Superintendent of Missions for the United Church an agreement was entered into by which a Community Church would be established at Marathon to be supervised by the Anglican Church while the Church in Terrace Bay would be under the guidance of the United Church.

In April, 1954, the degree of Dr. of Divinity was conferred on Mr. Lavender by the Senate of the United College in Winnipeg in recognition of his long and faithful service in the Ministry.

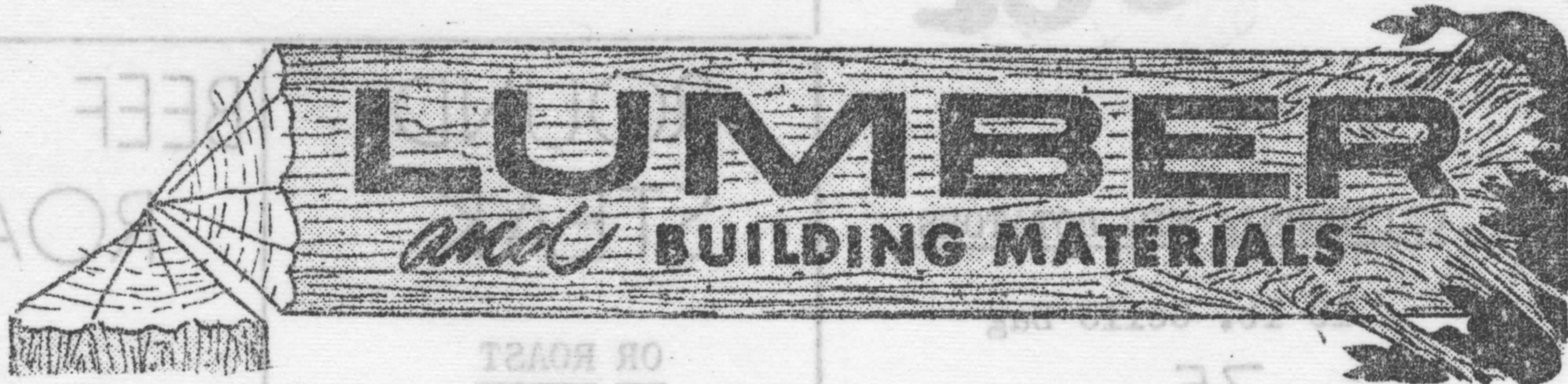
Although retiring from active ministry Dr. Lavender expects to still serve in the field of Christian endeavour, assisting the Minister at Mount Forest in pastoral visitation and ministering to the sick and shut-ins.

Dr. Lavender has been an active member and a Past President of the local Kiwanis Club.

The response of his friends to the farewell activities for Dr. Lavender speak most eloquently of the esteem and respect in which he is held.

On Sunday, June 25th Dr. Lavender will conduct his last official service in the Community Church. He will be sincerely missed by all, particularly the Sunday School children.

Everyone joins in wishing him good health and happiness in his active retirement from the ministry here and will look forward to a visit from him occasionally.
