## COUNCIL QUOTES FROM SCHREIBER

The Schreiber Municipal Council met on June 13th in the Municipal Hall with Reeve D'Arcy presiding and Councillors, Caccamo, G. Gordon, J.M. McGrath and F.V. Harness present.

Clerk-Treasurer R.C. Skinner read the minutes and business arising out of same included discussion on closing lane behind Holy Angels Church and a portion of Quebec St.

A letter of thanks from the O.P.P. was read together with one from the Department of Municipal Affairs advising the Township that a school would be held for assessment problems. R.C. Skinner was appointed to attend this meeting. Letter from the Lakehead Planning Board regarding a Study Conference in Community Planning to be held in September, 1960, was read.

A letter was sent to G.B. Garland, Dist. Engineer, Dept. of Highways re surplus culvert pipe 24". Correspondence also dealt with the problem which the present subway creates in Town and suggested that subway must have more

height and width to handle present day traffic problems and conditions.

A petition was read from the residents of Walker Street regarding roadway repairs and sidewalks be installed where necessary. The roadways are now started and a new petition will have to be taken if residents still require them to be made next year. Accounts re water works to amount of \$327.81 moved paid also General Accounts amounting to \$5,631.46.

A resident was instructed to clean scrap on premises.

A car lot must be cleared of old scrap cars.

In accordance with Ontario Hydro regulations, all new houses must have a 100 amp. service installed, also houses that have re-wiring and new services installed.

Gordon and McGrath were instructed to check into which sidewalks should be repaired with the money budgeted for 1960.

Re-assessment program, janitor's wages, and the purchase of 200' of fire hose for Fire Department were also discussed.

## NEW GROCERY STORE OPENS IN TERRACE BAY

On Wednesday morning at 10 A.M., Terrace Bay's new grocery store officially opened its doors to the public. "Tony's", the official name of the new concern, is as modern as tomorrow and no effort or expense has been spared to provide residents with everything from gourmet delicacies to the more mundane fare.

The basement features three walk-in temperature controlled units - one a deep freeze - one more moderate for storing fresh vegetables and another designed to keep dairy produce and eggs etc., at the proper temperature.

Rows of freezer chests line the walls and well stocked display counters include all the popular brand names of foodstuff. Meat will be packaged and dispensed at the rear of the store. A salad making machine is included in the up-to-date equipment and staples for the kitchen, sewing needs, baby needs (diapers, pants and socks etc.), are also in evidence.

Operated by the Caccamo family of Schreiber, Jack, a son, will manage the new store.

Operated on a Cash & Carry basis, the Management hopes to be able to bring prices which will compete favorably with those found in Lakehead markets.
