COMETS WIN TWO TO TAKE 2ND PLACE IN LEAGUE

In the first game Rex Taylor on the mound for the Comets held the Colonels to three hits, walked only two and struck out seven. Of the two runs the Colonels obtained only one was earned. The Terrace Bay players banged out thirteen hits with Ward, Kolody, Stachiw and Cliff getting two each.

Albert Guimont pitched the second game for Terrace and held the Colonels to six hits and one earned run. The Comet hitters slashed out eight hits with Osmar, Hansen and Cliff each getting two. One of Hansen's was a line shot home run over the right field fence.
