## COMETS DROP TWO TO RED ROCK

Last Sunday afternoon the Terrace Bay Comets played host to the Red Rock Paper Kings in Lakehead Senior Baseball action. As hosts the Terrace team was outstanding as they allowed the Paper Kings to sweep both ends of the double-header by the scores of 1-0 and 5-2.

Larry LaSarge pitching for Red Rock was outstanding in both games. In the first game he shut out the Comets, limiting them to three hits while striking out ten. Kolody, pitching for Terrace, also only allowed three hits and struck out seven. One of the hits Kolody allowed was a home run by Bonsall which won the game. Bonsall also collected a single for two of Red Rock's three hits. Guimont banged out two of the Comet's three hits.

Terrace started the second game well by hitting Red Rock's starting pitcher hard in the first inning. However, with two out in this inning and two Comet runners on base the Paper Kings again trotted out LaSarge who proceeded to defeat Terrace again by holding them to four hits and two runs the rest of the game. In this game LaSarge added to his strike out total by whiffing fourteen inept Comet hitters.

Wilkinson and Guimont allowed five hits and five runs. Gary LaSarge hit a home run and a double for Red Rock while Strobe collected two of the Terrace four hits.

At the present time we still need competitors in both the Boys' and girls' Open events (over 16 years of age).
