BASEBALL SEASON ENDS ON UNHAPPY NOTE

By this time everyone knows that the home-town Comets are out of the LBA play-offs and that they did not finish their regular schedule of twenty-six games.

To clear up the situation in the eyes of the local people the Terrace Bay Baseball Executive would like to express their point of view as follows:--

At the end of the Season came, which was July 31st, Terrace Bay had a tie game with Red Rock to replay, a rained out game with Red Rock to be played, and a game with the Port Arthur Colonels to be finished, as it had been halted by the curfew. The two games with Red Rock should have been re-scheduled to be played at Terrace Bay. One of these games was a home game for Red Rock and one a home game for Terrace. The reason both should have been re-scheduled at Terrace Bay was because Red Rock agreed at the beginning of the Season to play all their home games at the site of the team they were playing. The game with the Colonels had to be finished in Port Arthur.

To finish the entire schedule the LBA asked Terrace to come to Port Arthur on Sunday, August 7th and, starting at 1:00 P.M., finish the game with the Colonels, and then play two games with Red Rock. Reluctantly, our executive agreed to do this in order to expedite the play-offs and co-operate with the league. The games were rained out. The League called us that Sunday night and asked us to do the same the following Tuesday and start the first game at 6:30 P.M. We said "No" and stated that they should send Red Rock here Monday and Tuesday nights and, after those two games were completed, if we had to play the Colonels, we would come in. To this the LBA Executive said "No".

Neither side would give in. Then Terrace Bay was given an ultimatum to be in there by Wednesday at 6:30 P.M. or they would be disregarded for future play. We told them that this arrangement was practically impossible and we still felt Red Rock should be sent to Terrace Bay for two games. However, we again offered to compromise. If we went in Wednesday we would finish the game with the Colonels and play Red Rock one game. If we won those two or one of them, then Red Rock should be sent to Terrace Bay for the final game. Again the LBA Executive came out with a flat "NO". As a result Terrace disregarded the ultimatum and the League disregarded Terrace for further games.

The Terrace Bay Executive feel the LBA Executive is in the wrong as we wrote them last July 12th asking that the two games with Red Rock be re-scheduled at Terrace before the end of the Season, July 31st. They ignored us.

We do not know what the future holds for the team from Terrace Bay but RIGHT is RIGHT and WRONG is WRONG. We feel we were right.

SWIM TESTS FRIDAY, AUGUST 19TH

Red Cross Swim Tests will be held this Friday. Those taking part in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior tests must be at the Recreation Centre Curling Lounge at 8:30 A.M. SHARP.
