NEW ROAD SIGNS & TRAFFIC CHANGES FOR TOWN

Within the next few days new traffic signs will be erected in Town which will make several changes to the driving habits of motorists in the Community.

The main change will be to make SELKIRK AVENUE a THROUGH street, with all traffic coming to a stop on any intersection with Selkirk Avenue. Speed limit in town is 25 miles an hour and 40 miles per hour on highway 17. These limits will be rigidly enforced.

The following is a list of all the signs to be erected and, for your convenience, in the next issue of the 'News' a map will be reproduced showing all STOP and YIELD signs and their locations.

COUNCIL QUOTES

The financial meeting of the Terrace Bay Council was held in the Municipal Office on September 14th presided over by Reeve John Ferrier. Councillors Bouchard, Heenan, Evans-Smith and Duncan, together with Secretary Strutt and Clerk Hanley were in attendance.

Minutes of the August 10, meeting were perused and accepted and correspondence dealt with. Request by the Recreation Association for the appointment of a new member due to the demise of Mr.Alex MacDonald will be dealt with at a special meeting. Mr.Earl Smith was contacted prior to his retirement and Mr.Charles, his successor in the Department of Highways, in regards to a provincial grant for the extension and looping of Lakeview and Superior Avenues. This request will be forwarded by Mr.Smith to Toronto.

August Fire activities were reviewed in a report from Fire Chief Mr.George Maitland. On behalf of the Fire Department Reeve Ferrier had accepted an award last month from Mr.Cottenden of the Fire Marshall's Office, for the Department's special work during Fire Prevention Week.

A suggested stop-over in Terrace Bay during the Highway opening ceremonies September 17th, received from Mr. J. Harvey Johnson of the Port Arthur Chamber of Commerce was accepted. Reeve and Mrs. Ferrier will travel to Wawa for the Opening Ceremonies.

A letter of appreciation was sent by the Reeve to the local Horticultural Society for their outstanding contribution to the community throughout the year which culminated with their annual exhibition. Mr.Ferrier felt the attractive grounds in Terrace Bay had been encouraged largely by the Society.

Following a report by Constable Hayes on the wounding of bears by arrows and similar methods, Council felt the By-Law should be amended to include use of any lethal weapons. Another suggestion by Constable Hayes for a warning bell to enforce the nine P.M. curfew was thoroughly discussed by Council. A request for a visit from Mr.A.H.Angus, Probation Officer will be made before any further action is taken.

Accounts from the Recreation Committee, Library, Hydro and Township were presented. Building Permits for August totalled \$33,700.

Reeve Ferrier suggested a commerce committee be formed to handle public relations of the town, possibly on a two or three year trial basis.
