LAKE SUPERFOR HIGHWAY ASSOCIATION HOLDS ANNUAL (MEETING

This Association held their annual meeting in Port Arthur on Friday, October 28th. The Lake Superior Highway Association represents municipalities, Chambers of Commerce and Tourist organizations on the circle route around Lake Superior.

A new executive and Board of Directors was elected by the Association as follows:-President - C.W. King of Port Arthur Sec. Treasurer - R.O. Beggs, Port Arthur Vice-Presidents elected were, Mayor Roy Lynn of Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan and Bryan O'Brien of Fort William. F.O. Soughton, Chairman of the Terrace Bay Commerce Committee was elected to the Board of Directors as a member at large. The Terrace Bay Commerce Committee is now an official member of the Association. One objective of the Association has already been achieved: to bring about the building of the highway around Lake Superior. The main objective now is to secure, encourage and publicize travel to and in the Lake Superior area. Plans are being formulated to give in-creased publicity to the circle route which, it is hoped, will include publicity by Federal, Provincial and State authorities as well as by area organizations. The people of Terrace Bay will be interested to learn that the Board of Directors of the Association tentatively plan to meet in Terrace Bay on February 17th, 1961. Previous meetings of Directors have been held in Duluth, Sault Ste. Marie, Fort William and Wawa.
