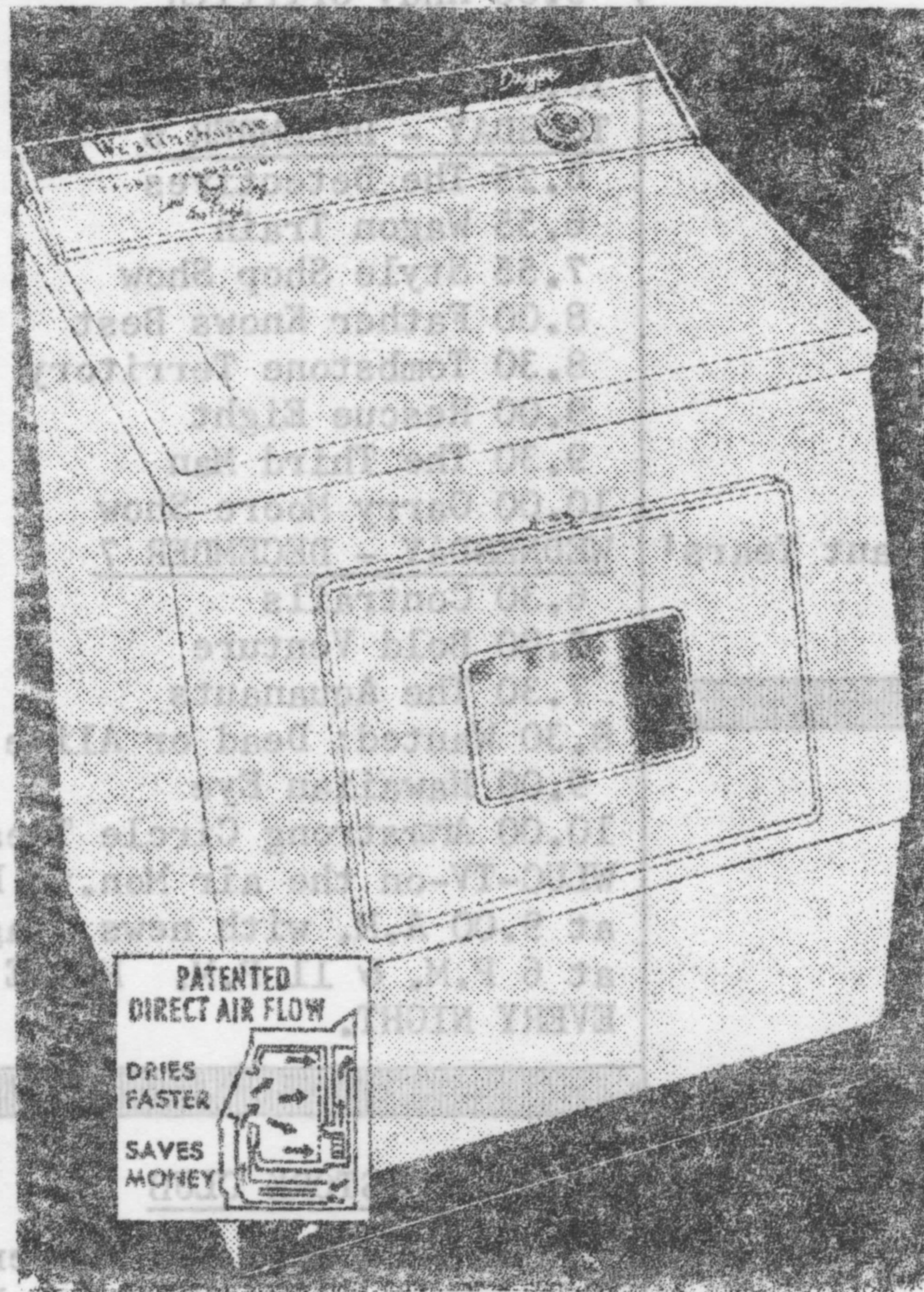

Council met in the Terrace Bay Municipal Offices Wednesday afternoon to sit at their last session before Nomination Night. Presiding was the Deputy Reeve Mr. J. Heenan, and present also were Councillors Mrs. B. Bouchard, Mr. D. Evans-Smith and Mr. J. Duncan together with Secretary Treasurer Mr. W.F. Strutt and Assistant W. Hanley.

Preparations to receive the new Town Constable, Mr. H. Billings were being finalized by Council. Applications for the position of Acting Fire Chief have been received and would be dealt with after the entry deadline.

The letter of appreciation and congratulation given Mr. Ken Ward, with his presentation by Mr. Heenan on behalf of the Council was read. Ken recently received his "A" certificate from

the University of Western Ontario.

Recreation Association Accounts were duly read and accepted.

Clarification was read of the by-law stating that no person who appears on the defaulters list is entitled to vote on the municipal election. Husband or wife of said defaulter, however, would still be entitled to vote.

Mr. Evans-Smith reported on the meeting held Tuesday of the Commerce Committee and outlined their present objectives in maintaining and furthering the prosperity of Terrace Bay.
