So that we may have a successful party, please see that your child obeys the following instructions.

1. Children must come only to the party

for their own age group.

2. Children MUST NOT misrepresent their age. Gifts are of equal value, and have been purchased according to the exact number of children in each age group. If one child misrepresents his age, he upsets the entire distribution system.

3. Ages are to be considered as the child's age NOW. Half years are not considered. FOR EXAMPLE, if a child is 5½ years old now, he is considered

to be a five-year-old.

4. IF YOUR CHILD IS SICK, send a note, signed by a parent, stating name and age. Also include the name of the person who is to pick up the gift.

W.E.D'Arcy emerged again as Reeve of Schreiber following Monday's election. Sparked by a group of Schreiber business men and interested citizens, the elction proved to be one of the liveliest in several years. E. Gino Caccamo, the other candidate for Mayor was defeated by forty-six votes.

Voting on the three councillors was also close. F.V. Harness topped the polls with 433 which makes him a two-year Councillor and J.P. Guina was second with 338--placing him too on the two-year term. The lone distaff candidate, Mrs. I. McCuaig, placed third with 312 votes, putting her in for a one year term.

The office of Hydro Commissioner will be filled by J.D. Phillips who received 300 votes. J.E.Stokes and J.Caccamo received 209 and 195

respectively.

A pre-election Rally, sponsored by the same group of Schreiber business men and citizens, was held in the Town Hall on December 6th.

Mrs. J.D. Bryson accompanied 'O Canada' and the Chairman, R.B. Spadoni, welcomed those present and outlined both the purpose of and procedure for the meeting. A guest speaker, Mr. S. Korchuk, chose as his topic "Organized Recreation in Schreiber.

Candidates for Reeve took the platform next and presented their views, followed by Mr.G. Gordon who addressed "Councillor Candidates and Future Councillors of Schreiber."

Each of the Candidates for Council and Hydro Commission were given an opportunity to speak and a question and answer period follow-

Comments by the Chairman and God Save The Queen concluded the meeting.
